Message from the President Proposed Increase to EOSARDA Membership Fees

What fees does EOSARDA collect and for whom do we collect them?

Annually, EOSARDA's collects membership fees for:

- EOSARDA
- the Ontario Square and Round Dance Federation (OSRDF) and
- the Canadian Square and Round Dance Society (CSRDS)

There are two levels of fees:

- a per Member Club/Association fee and
- a per dancer/dance leader fee

Member Club/Association fee

- The annual Member Club/Association fee is currently \$10.00 per club
 - \$2.00 of this is retained by the Association (EOSARDA Membership fee)
 - \$8.00 goes to the OSRDF to cover both Federation and Society fees

Dancer/Dance Leader fee

- The annual Dancer/Dance Leader fee is currently \$8.00 per person
 - \$2.00 of this is retained by the Association (EOSARDA Membership fee)
 - \$6.00 goes to the OSRDF to cover both Federation and Society fees.

A small part of the CSRDS fee pays for Dancer Insurance

Why is EOSARDA considering raising its Membership fees?

For the past several years, EOSARDA has been operating on a deficit budget, drawing down on our financial reserves in an attempt to recruit new dancers and train new Dance Leaders (Callers, Cuers etc)

Concerned about the decline in our financial reserves, the November 2024 Council of Dancers directed the Board to draft a budget for Dance Year 2025/26 that would better align spending and expected revenues and to present the draft budget to the April 2025 Council of Dancers.

While no formal vote was taken in November, there was a general consensus among Voting Dele-

gates that EOSARDA's annual membership fees for both Clubs/Associations and Dancer/Dance Leaders should be significantly increased.

How much is the proposed increase?

At the Council of Dancers meeting on Sunday, April 27, 2025, it was moved that:

"In accordance with discussion at the November Council of Dancers meeting, effective July 1, 2025, the annual EOSARDA Membership fee be increased by \$5 so that the EOSARDA dancer and club fees would each be \$7."

This would result in the following fee structure for Dance Year 2025/26

Club/Association Membership fee

EOSARDA \$7.00 (a \$5.00 increase)

OSRDF/CSRDS \$8.00 (no change)

Total \$15.00 per Club/Association

Dancer/Dance Leader Membership Fee

EOSARDA \$7.00 (a \$5.00 increase)

OSRDF/CSRDS \$6.00

Total \$13.00 per dancer/Dance Leader

What is the status of the proposed increase?

A decision on the Motion has been deferred pending consultation with all EOSARDA Member Clubs and Associations.

Member Clubs/Associations now have the opportunity to discuss the above Motion with their Executive and club members and may also share their thoughts and comments online if they wish.

A special meeting of the Council of Dancers will be convened early in June for a vote on the Motion. At that time, Council will also be presented with a draft Operating Budget for 2025/26 that will take into account the results of the vote on the Motion.

Hello Danglers!

Happy Spring!!!!!!! I am sure that you all have had a wonderful dance season! Have you been keeping track of all the dances you have been attending? A reminder that there is STILL LOTS OF TIME to submit a form for the EOSAR-DA Visit Dangle Program for the 2024-2025 dance season! Check out Calendar (eodance.ca) to refresh your memory and see what dances you attended! There are still more dances coming in May and workshops as well!

The program runs from September 1, 2024 to August 31 2025.

The great news...... have already received three forms!!

As a reminder, the best way for any dancer to become stronger is to dance more often, and visiting another club is a great way to do this!! A different caller or cuer will present things in a slightly different way and this is a fabulous way to improve your skills!

2024 - 2025



Check out <u>Calendar (eodance.ca)</u> to see what is dances are coming up! A reminder that we made changes to the dance dangle program, to make it THAT much easier for you to participate and track your visits to dance events

We have removed the requirement to obtain a signature to verify that a dancer did participate.

Attendance at any club other than the club where the dancer pays the EOSARDA registration fee counts toward the Dangle. This also includes dancers who may dance with a second or third club on a regular basis – limited to one visit per club. Attendance at any workshop, special event, summer dance and/or convention, including outside Canada all qualify towards the dance dangle.



To obtain your dance dangle:

Complete the required number of visits during a single dance year. No signatures are required. Submit completed <u>application form</u> and send it to <u>dancedangles@eosarda.ca</u> on or before September 30 of the next dance year.

Let's get those forms rolling in and increase the number of dancers who will earn their dangles for 2024-2025!

DAVE WESTERN— AWARD OF EXCELLENCE



The award of excellence is presented by the Canadian Square and Round Dance Society. It is an award that recognizes outstanding contributions to the Canadian Square and Round Dance community. There have only been a select few who have earned this award from Eastern Ontario since its inception in 1987. Dave is now one of them.

His nomination includes his contribution to the square and round dance movement over the years at, not only the local and provincial level, but at the national level as well.

Dave was previously recognized for his achievements at the provincial level in 2016 when he and his wife Pearl received the Ontario Trillium Merit Award.

His achievements include serving as:

- President of EOSARDA from 2009 until the present. The position of president of EOSARDA was always considered a 2 year commitment. Dave has held this position for 16 years.
- Director on the board of the Ontario Square and Round Dance Federation
- Vice chair for the 2014 Canadian Square and Round Dance Festival as well as organizing the vendor village.
- initiating programs such as "the Young Dancer Program", "the Square and Round Dance Week", and organizing a dance team called "the EOSARDA Eagles"
- teaching line dancing for 10 years through his own club- "Got Lines-Line Dancing"

Now on to his achievement at the Canadian national level of square and round dancing, and thus his nomination for this award.

Canada's Copyright Act provides for the mandatory payment of royalties for the public "performance" of music in Canada. "Performance" includes the playing of live and of recorded music. The amounts payable are established through two series of Tariffs set by the Copyright Board of Canada, one for SOCAN and one for Re:Sound.

A company called Entandem was established in 2019, as a joint venture with SOCAN and Re:Sound. Entandem collects annual licencing fees on behalf of SOCAN and Re:Sound; distributes the fees to their respective rights holders and issues annual Music Licences.

Either the club or the dance leader must hold a valid Music Licence issued by Entandem in order for music to be played at a dance event.

Over the years there has been considerable disagreement and confusion both between Canadian Square and Round Dance Society members and Entandem and within Entandem/SOCAN/Re:Sound as to the annual cost of an Entandem Music License and the applicable licensing terms and conditions. As a result, most Canadian Square and Round Dance Society members were paying too much for their annual Music License and many did not hold the correct licence.

In the spring of 2021, Dave approached Geoff Clarke, Gavin Currie and Arlo Speer with a proposal that, with Society's approval, they form a team to negotiate a formal agreement between the Canadian Square and Round Dance Society and Entandem /SOCAN/Re:Sound.

It took a little longer than originally expected, but two years later the Canadian Square and Round Dance Society and Entandem, acting on behalf of SOCAN and Re:Sound signed a comprehensive agreement that standardized Music Licence fees for all Canadian Square and Round Dance Society members while greatly simplifying the annual reporting procedure.

The Society has recognized this effort and, along with all of the contributions that Dave has made, has concluded that indeed Dave should be the newest recipient of "the Award of Excellence"

The committee's focus has been on identifying a way to work with clubs to enhance recruitment and visibility of square dancing. To that end, we have identified an initiative that we have named **Fair Squares**. The goal is to work with clubs to provide needed resources and to identify fairs, events or locations where there is strong potential to increase awareness, interest and, of course, participation in modern square dancing. Help is here for the asking!

Wendy VanderMeulen and Lamar Mason, who administer the **EOSARDA FB page**, met with Carole Lauzon to learn more about boosting messages on the FB page and advertising to increase visibility. A sincere thank you goes out to Carole for sharing her knowledge with us.

The Facebook page is regularly updated with open dance notifications and upcoming events provided to us by the clubs in .jpg for easy posting to Facebook.

The Publicity Committee will be working with EOSARDA's webmaster and clubs to **collect open house information** early this summer so events can be highlighted on the webpage separately from the general club dance schedules.

The Publicity Committee continues to examine ways it can provide advertising and promotional resources to EOSARDA clubs. Fair Squares Project

A Recruitment Proposal by the EOSARDA Publicity Committee

Problem Definition

For over 20 years, the rate of recruitment of new dancers by our Basic and SSD Member Clubs, (Recruiting Clubs) has failed to keep pace with the loss of experienced dancers through age-related attrition (retirement, relocation, poor health and death). The resulting decrease in the number of paid members has forced some clubs to close down, while others are struggling to stay afloat.

The loss of local newspapers and the attendant loss of local advertising opportunities has made it difficult for Recruiting Clubs to effectively advertise for new members at a reasonable cost.

Unless a way can be found to reverse the current membership trend Modern Square Dancing will eventually cease to exist as an organized activity in Eastern Ontario.

Project Proposal

EOSARDA's Publicity Committee proposes working with each of our recruiting clubs to plan, organize and conduct a New Dancer Recruiting Campaign at one or more summer or fall fairs in the club's catchment area. The activity would involve dance demonstrations and the ability to distribute information about the local clubs and square dancing.

Objectives

- To increase the registered membership of each participating club by 10% or more.
- To increase awareness and the visibility of Modern Square Dancing.

Background

A great many late-summer and fall fairs take place annually across Eastern Ontario. Most of these are relatively small local events that provide a gathering place for the local community. As such, they are a golden opportunity for recruiting clubs to reach their local audiences in an efficient and cost-effective way.

With the exception of the Meri Squares and the Ottawa Date Squares, all our recruiting clubs have at least one fair located in their proximate catchment area. It may be possible for both Ottawa-based clubs to take advantage of fairs/events located outside the city or to identify an event within the city that serves as the same type of gathering event. The Ottawa Date Squares has historically used Pride Week for its recruiting activities: we could assist with that if requested. Clubs in neighbouring areas might want to work together at several events.

Participants' roles

The Publicity Committee:

- Identify promotional materials suitable for distribution at fairs, identify a source of supply and provide a cost estimate to the Board for approval;
- Contact the executive of each of our recruiting clubs to solicit their active involvement in this project;
- In consultation with each participating club identify the fair(s) in which the club is willing to participate this year; With the active involvement of each participating club, contact the governing body of each targeted fair and offer to provide entertainment at the fair in the form of a series of demo dances in exchange for an area that the participating club can use to promote its dance program;
- Seek to establish a list of volunteers from all Member Clubs who are willing to take part in demo dances at select fairs;
- If needed, work with the OACA to identify Callers willing to take part in Fair Squares;
- If necessary, identify and obtain recorded material that can be used for demo dancing if no Caller is available:
- Work with each participating club to establish a demo dance timetable and a roster of dancers for the target fair.

Clubs who Participate:

- In collaboration with Publicity Committee contact the governing body of each targeted fair and offer to provide entertainment at the fair in the form of a series of demo dances in exchange for an area that the club can use to promote its dance program;
- Provide at least one square of demo dancers for each scheduled demo dance (possibly supplemented by volunteers from other clubs);
- Provide suitable club promotional material for distribution at the fair;
- Ensure that an information booth or table is staffed by club volunteers during agreed hours;
- If possible, have the club Caller take part in the demo dances;
- If the Club Caller is not available for some or all of the schedule demo dances find a suitable alternative with the assistance of the Publicity Committee;
- Create a contact list of fair goers who indicate an interest in taking part in Modern Square Dancing;
- Ensure that all the people on the contact list are contacted by someone from the club within two weeks of the date of the fair; and
- Ensure that interested people are given the opportunity to start square dancing within a reasonable time
 from the date of the fair. That is, If the fair is in June but dancing starts officially in September, perhaps arrange a special open house to invite interested people in late July or early August to maintain interest.

Budget proposal

The Publicity Committee is proposing to use the \$2000 currently in the approved 2024-2025 EOSARDA budget toward this activity and front-load our costs. These funds would be used to cover the cost of giveaways, printed materials, participation fees, etc. Clubs would be encouraged to contribute financially in those areas that qualify under the EOSARDA New Dancer Recruitment Program in 2025-2026 and to provide volunteers. It is hoped that club callers would be prepared to donate their time as well.



Let Us Re-introduce the 2026 Callers



Dan Sahlstrom lives in Minnesota with his wife, Janet, and their four children. He began square dancing in 1978 (age 12) and called his first dance in 1979. He calls through C2 and Cues through PH 4. Currently Dan records on the Hi Hat music label and is a member of CALLERLAB. In addition to being active in his regional and state caller associations, he has been on the staff of numerous caller clinics and schools including NE Callers School, North Star Callers School and many GSI Callers Schools. Dan met his wife Janet through square dancing and it continues to be a large part of their lives. Homeschooling has allowed their four children, all dancing at least Plus, to frequently travel to dance at various square dance festivals, weekends and conventions throughout the US and Canada, where Dan is often the featured caller.

If you ask Dan his philosophy of a night of dancing, he would tell you that, above anything else, everyone has to have a good time.



Brent Mawdsley is an international caller residing in Delta, British Columbia with his wife, Therese, and two daughters, Amanda and Meaghan. Definitely a square dance family! Brent began calling at the age of 13 and was senior calling champion of the Pacific Northwest Teen Festival for four years. Since then, he has called for several local clubs and continues to call two to four times a week for Brent's Bunch. Brent is also in demand as a caller for many regional and national festivals. Most recently Brent was one of the most popular callers with hundreds of square dancers who attended the Canadian National Square Dance Festival this past summer.

Brent calls Basic through A-2, is a high-energy caller who believes his role is to provide a dance where the dancers are having fun.



David Hutchinson, from Marlbank, Ontario, comes from a square dance family; he started dancing at the age of six and a year later called his first square dance - "Tie Me Kangaroo Down". Dave has been calling professionally since 1978 and calls the Basic level through the C2 level. He has been calling for clubs across Eastern Ontario and currently is the caller for three clubs. He also calls at weekend workshops for several regional clubs. David has also been staff at a number of large weekend festivals, most recently at the Toronto District International Convention, at the Ottawa IAGSDC 2024, and has been hired as staff for Montreal Mix 2026, the 43rd IAGSDC Convention. He has an exceptional way of instructing and quickly has new dancers comfortable. When asked why he works so hard at calling, his response is,

"I do what I do because I love square dancing. I love the intricacies and how they can be put together, but mostly, it's about the people I have met and the lifelong friendships I've made in the square dance world."


