Message from the President, December 2025

Wishing all of you a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

As I write this the New Year is peeking around the corner, which means that we are about halfway through the new dance season. So, how's it going so far? From where I sit, the answer is "not bad".

Fall Registrations

When dancing resumed this Autumn, 572 registered dancers took to the dance floor. Of these, the greatest number (528) were Square Dancers and their Callers. But there were also 14 Round Dancers and 30 Cloggers. That means that for the second year in a row, our total membership has increased slightly, going from 556 in March 2025to 560 this Autumn.

Admittedly, that's not a big increase, but is a step in the right direction. What's more, many of our Member Clubs will be undertaking a second recruiting drive in January, so it is likely that our numbers will increase yet again in the new year.

We want to remind all dancers about the EOSARDA Visit Dangle Program!

So how do you earn a dangle?

Check out <u>Calendar</u> on <u>eodance.ca</u> to learn what events are happening over the next while. Remember that changes were made to the Visit Dangle Program to make it THAT much easier for you to track and participate! Dancers no longer need to obtain a signature at each event.

Attendance at any club other than the club where the dancer pays the EOSARDA registration fee qualifies. This also includes dancers who may dance with a second or third club on a regular basis, limited to one visit per club.

Attendance at any workshop, special event, summer dance and/or convention, including outside Canada, also counts in the Visit Dangle Program.

To obtain your dance dangle:

Complete the required number of visits during a single dance year and submit your completed application form to dancedagles@eosarda.ca on or before September 30, 2026.

So get out visit other clubs so those forms come rolling in come fall! Let's increase the number of dancers who will earn their dangles for 2025-2026!



Convention Update

Are you registered for the Montréal convention yet? If you haven't registered, the number of days until the next price increase is limited because on January 1, the rate goes from \$315 to \$345.

That price includes a full weekend of amazing square dancing at all levels (SSD/MS through C4) to eleven of the best callers in the world, a banquet supper and a breakfast buffet meal. Also some really fun specialty tips like women's tip, bear tip, leather tip, last man standing, hot hash and many more.

If you've never attended an IAGSDC convention before, you qualify for a special first-timer rate of \$275. Check out the registration page of the website for details on how to get it.

If your reason for not attending the convention is financial, you should definitely check out the special subsidy that's available to anyone who can't afford to attend. Do it before the subsidies run out.

Either way, the host hotel (Le Centre Sheraton) is filling up fast. Rooms are 95% booked already so if you plan to attend, you should reserve your room asap. You can cancel the hotel up to 72 hours in advance with no penalty.

Free Intro - January 7

December 10 may be our graduation, but we will be dancing on December 17 as well and it will be our last class of the season.

We will be returning to classes on Wednesday, January 7 with a FREE open house/intro followed by the start of a brand new season of Social Square Dancing classes.







With the quality of instructors and two potential experienced teaching assistants, this school would be valuable to all callers from brand new to very experienced. In addition to joint sessions, students would likely be split into groups depending on experience and areas of interest.

Dates: Friday, July 10th to Tuesday, July 14th in the city of Penticton (still working on the venue). Friday will start later in the day but Saturday, Sunday, Monday and Tuesday will be all day and evening.

Other Details:

For students, funding should be available from Callerlab, the Canadian Square and Round Dance Society in addition to provincial associations and possibly state associations to help offset costs.

Anticipated tuition is \$500.00 CDN per participating student. Spouses and partners are also encouraged to attend and may be requested to assist by providing dancers on which the students can practice. We have also found that partners can be a real help to the students in their learning process.

We are looking at the possibility that lunches may be provided as well as mid session snacks.
